Kenwood House is a former stately home managed by English Heritage. It houses a few paintings by Swiss-born artist Angelica Kauffman (1741 – 1807). Her talent, ambition and beauty propelled her into artistic prominence in the celebrity social circle, and beyond, of 18th-century Europe.

Refreshments can be enjoyed at the cafe after the event. Prices vary from £5 for tea and cake to £12 – £15 for a warm lunch. The café has indoor and outdoor sections. Please note that refreshments are not included in the price of the visit and visitors will have to pay for their refreshments separately.
